165,623 Meals Distributed through 969 total food distributions, a 10% increase from last year

Message from our Executive Director

2024 was eventful for Hamilton County Harvest Food Bank and through the community's overwhelming support we provided food for 165,623 meals through 969 separate distributions. This was a 10% increase from the previous year. Food pantries and meal programs across the county all report that the need is increasing and that ensuring healthy food is always accessible is a challenge. We saw our own challenges as donations have decreased while food purchases have needed to grow, over 21% in one year, to meet the need.

Blessedly, the Hamilton County Food Support Network is growing together to meet these opportunities with each other's support. We are excited to announce that our long search for a new home where we could co-locate all of our operations in ONE place finally resulted in our move to 89 S. Byron St., Cicero in February 2025. This new space is larger and purposefully set up to best serve the ever-increasing needs of the food pantries and meals programs we work with year-round. Our volunteers contributed over 300+ hours in two weeks in the move and reorganization – THANK YOU! We are ever so grateful to White River Christian Church and their Food Pantry personnel for being the most gracious hosts for 15+years. Looks for more updates as we continue to consolidate our operations.

On a bittersweet but joyful note, this will be my last message to you as your Executive Director of the Food Bank. I am retiring the end of March. Suzanna Hobson will continue to lead the Food Bank in so many new and meaningful ways. God nudged me to pursue this adventure over 17 years ago, and serving the food pantries and volunteers in our local community has brought forth a harvest of blessings every day. The seeds we have all planted together through the years have strong roots and will be a foundation in ensuring that ALL in our community have access to healthy food for years to come.

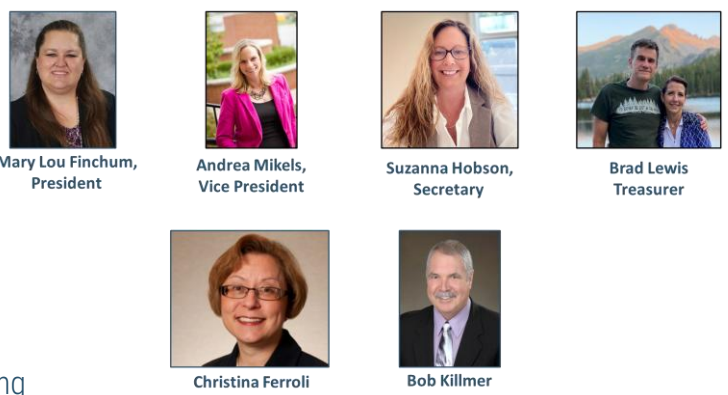

9.2% of the people living in Hamilton County are currently food insecure.

78% are likely ineligible for SNAP benefits due to income limits

Year after year, Hamilton County Harvest Food Bank proves itself to be an indispensable lifeline for acquiring and distributing food to our local food pantries and partners. Our impact reverberates far beyond the statistics, touching every resident's life and underscoring its vital role in fostering a stronger, more resilient community for all.

Our 15th year of serving Hamilton County solidified our vision "Every resident in Hamilton County will have access to healthy, nutritious food". The search for a new location was crucial to achieve our vision.

Continued as Co-Leader of HCCF Community Food Resource Coalition which continues to break down barriers and increase partnerships, such as Second Helpings, with the whole HC food support network.

Champion for Community Compass, the best resource for food insecure individuals to find food locally.

Hosted Fall and Spring Roundtables with food pantries/programs in addition to year round connections via group texts, listening visits, and critical one on one relationship building.

Food Donations and Food Drives

Non-perishable food donors = 84; Produce donors = 36, Meat donors = 13 for a total of \$150,940 of community support

Post-COVID overall food donation levels continue to lower, a 6% drop from previous year. Holiday School drives were strong - proving 27,000+ meals alone. In 2024, monetarily, donations made up 46% of all food distributed

We continued our long established history with Hamilton County community food drives: 15th year for holiday and business school drives, 8th year for Stamp Out Hunger and 7th year for Pack the Cruiser



Youth – Meals for Kids – High School Ambassadors

Hamilton County's child food insecurity rate is 7.8%, or an estimated 7,120 children, an increase of 39% in one year

52% are likely ineligible for federal nutrition programs

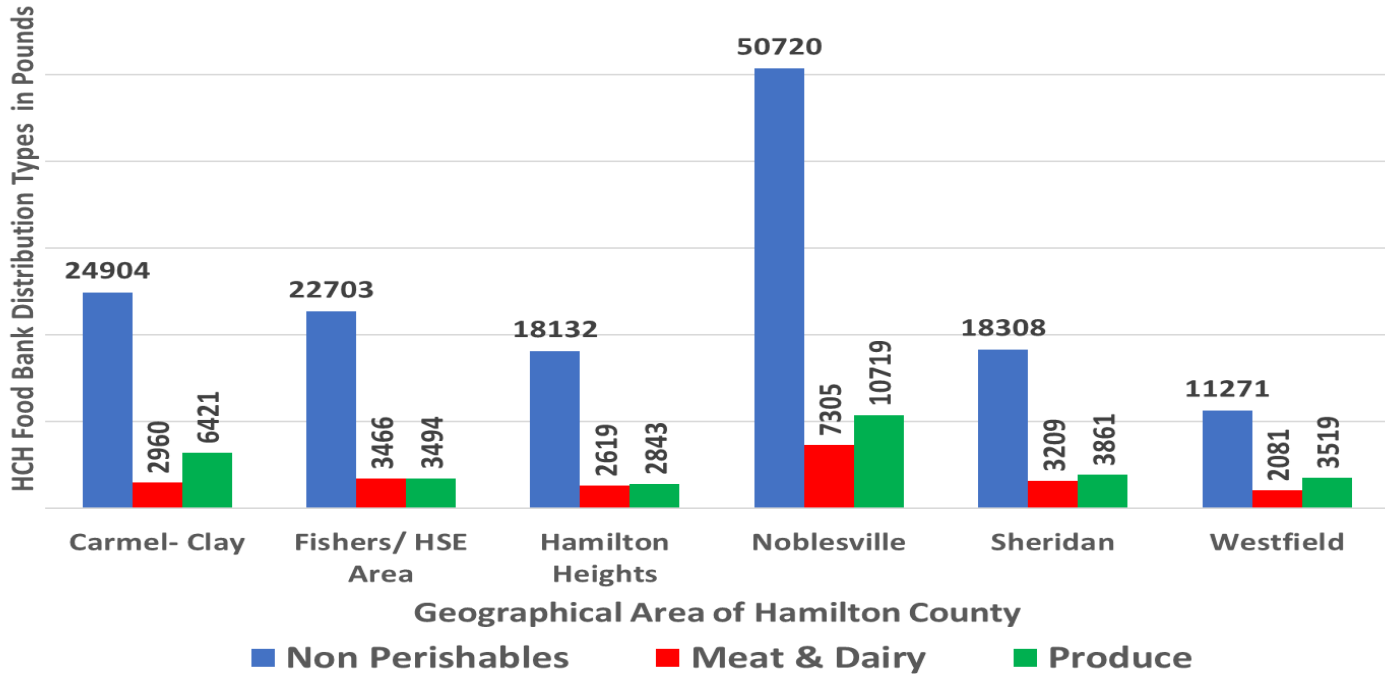

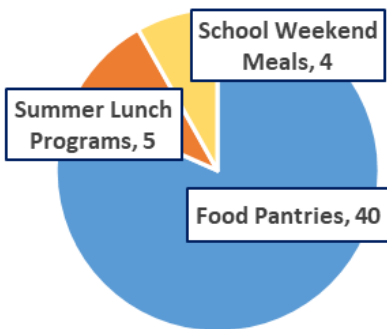

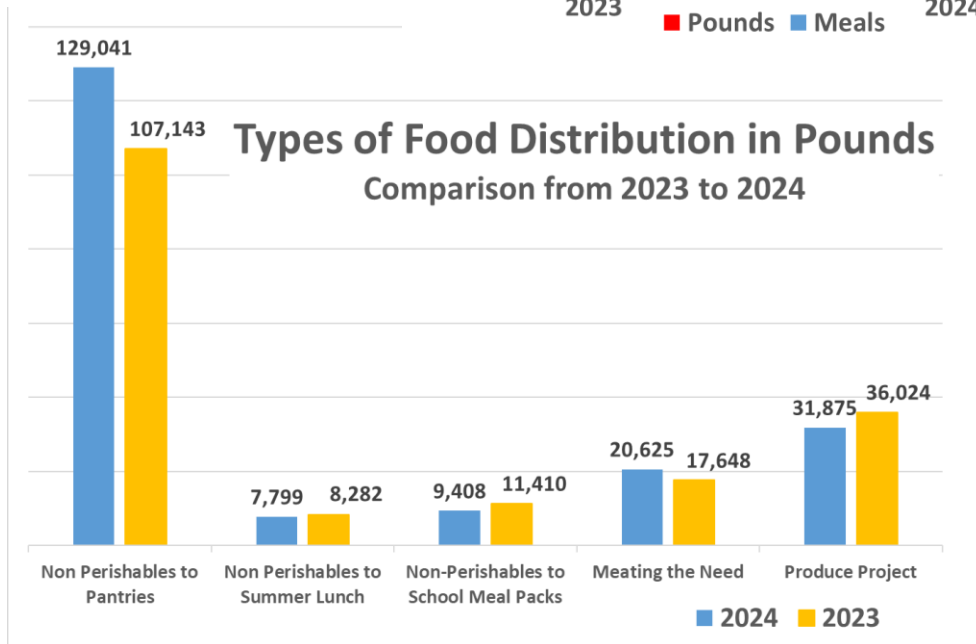
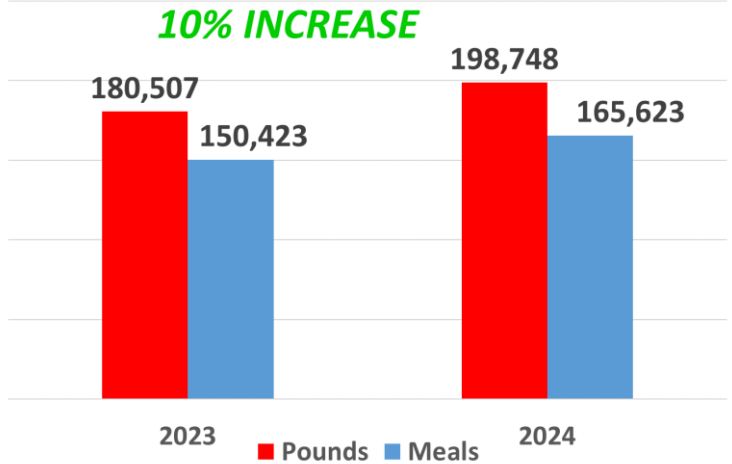
Program Services IMPACT

505 Volunteers – 5433 hours – Increase of 12% over 2023

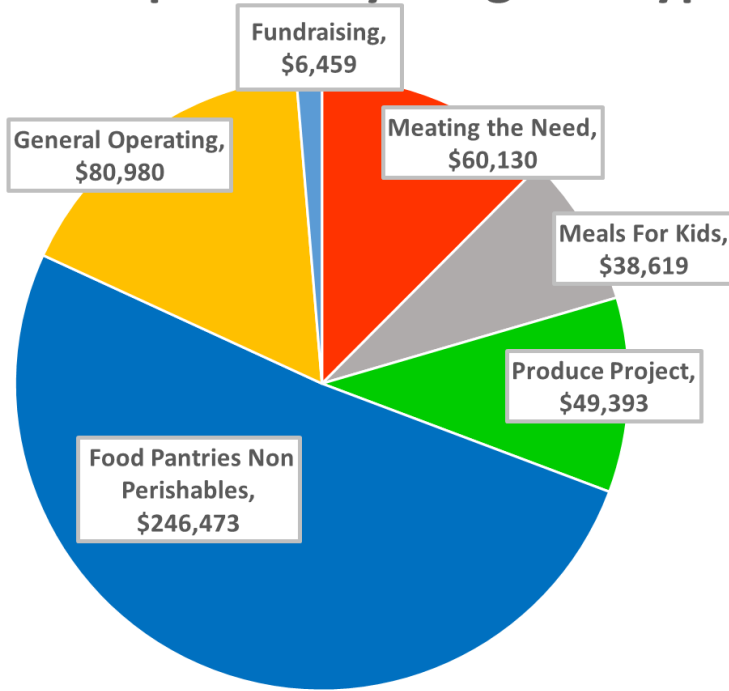

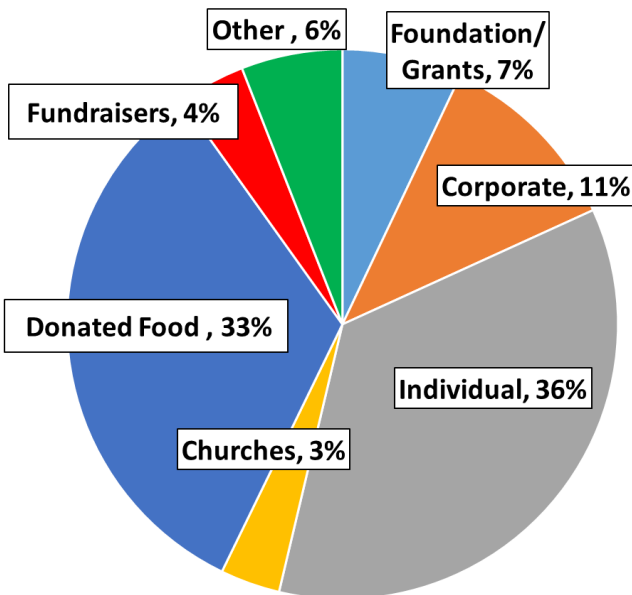
Resources and Financial Review

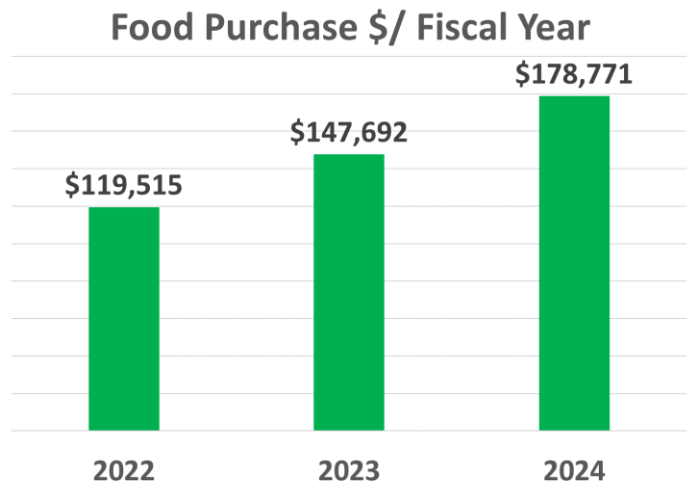
Annual Expenses by Program Type
